Requirements

Students applying to the F-1 Public High School
Program must be between the ages of 14 and
18 years old.



English level requirements will vary by district.

Students can study for a maximum of 1 year on the F-1 Public program, unless enrolled in a Dual-Enrollment Program.



Program Types

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Students can apply to the F-1 Public High School Program for a semester, an academic year, or a calendar year.



Select districts also offer short-term programs, which range from 9-13 weeks.



Select public school districts offer boarding facilities.

Application Process



The F-1 Public School Program offers rolling admission.

The F-1 Public team will work with each student on their application until they are accepted by their desired district.

Students will apply to a school district. If the district has multiple schools, high school preferences are forwarded to the district offices, but they cannot be guaranteed.

Each school district has its own policies and procedures; therefore the acceptance process will vary.






Program Fees



Program fees vary widely from district to district.




Fees include school placement, tuition, host family placement and stipend, airport pick up/ drop off, 24/7 emergency hotline, and program supervision.

Introducing New F-1 Public Short Term Programs

Can't study abroad for a full semester?

Select districts can offer official transcripts and an exciting cultural and educational experience for students who want the opportunity to live and study in the United States, but do not have a full year or semester to dedicate to the program. All students are placed with caring host families and are supervised by trained SMG Representatives.









The SMG F-1 Public Host Family

The host family and student relationship is an integral part of the student exchange experience and often one of the most unforgettable parts of the program. SMG carefully screens and selects each host family in order to place our students with caring families, who will provide a safe and loving environment for the student.

Host families receive compensation for hosting to cover necessary costs such as food, electricity, and gasoline. All families participating in the program are interested in opening their homes and sharing their lives with a student from abroad. These families understand the value of cultural exchange and have a genuine interest in helping an international student understand the American way of life.



The SMG Local Representative

Each student will be assigned an SMG Local Representative before their arrival in the United States. Our Local Representatives are individuals in the local community who support our exchange students and host families throughout the year. They are trained to assist students with any issues, problems, or questions they may have. The local representative will contact the student at least once per month (and often more frequently) to make sure that they are adjusting successfully to American culture and family life. SMG also has a 24-hour emergency number available to students, monitored by a staff member in New Jersey, to provide additional support when needed.



How to apply

STEP Choose Your 01 School

Select the school that best matches your budget, interests, goals, and location. What are your goals for the program? Are there any courses, sports, or clubs that you want to participate in? SMG will work with your international partner to recommend the best schools to fit your program goals.

STEP **O2** Apply to SMG

SMG uses an online application called EXITS to easily organize all of the documents you will need. Using the application, you or your international partner will upload required documentation like medical history, school transcripts, an English evaluation, and a copy of your passport. In some cases, you may need to complete additional paperwork if it is requested by your chosen school. We will keep you updated on every step of the process! Work directly with one of SMG's international partners to complete and submit your online application through the student portal.

STEP Acceptance & Host Family

Once you've been accepted to SMG and your chosen district/ school, we will start looking for your host family. As soon as we have your host family placement, you will be notified immediately. Each host family fills out an application much like the student application with personal information, pictures, letters, and more! Start communicating with your host family to learn more about them, the community, and the school you'll be attending. Work with your host family to plan the exchange of your dreams!

STEP Visa 04 & Arrival

Once we send you the host family placement, you will receive your visa documents. You will need to make a visa appointment at the closest US Consulate as soon as possible to obtain your F-1 visa.
